- 11. Department Head's Reports
 - DPW Superintendent J. Bechy
 - O The old garbage truck and old community room chairs with racks (50 chairs, 3 racks) were put on Auctions International. Received a bid of \$9,300 for the garbage truck and \$65 for the chairs and racks. The Board agreed to not sell truck or chairs. J. Bechy will reach out to his contacts in Oneida County to see if anyone is interested in a used garbage truck. The chairs will be advertised with other sources.
 - The control system for the air handler at the Village Hall that was damaged due to a
 power surge was approved by the insurance company for the cost of repair minus the
 deductible.
 - O A representative from NYS DOT called to inquire whether the Village was considering replacing the water lines on Stafford Ave (NYS Route 12). DOT would like to pave the state road and replace some sidewalks, but do not want to start the project until any lead water lines projects have been completed. J. Bechy will reach out to the State DOT to receive more information on their plans.
 - o The annual Cruisin' Into Waterville will be held on Sept. 21st

• Fire Department

- o FC Waufle was not in attendance but submitted a written report
 - The fire department thanked DPW Superintendent Bechy for providing traffic cones for former Waterville Fire Department President, Bob Winfield's funeral, and for providing the garbage truck for his final ride procession.
 - Truck 421 was sent to Syracuse for annual inspection
 - The fire department has joint practices planned with Oriskany Falls and Deansboro
 - There were 27 calls for the month of August

• Clerk/Treasurer G. Barnes

- O Presented a CDBG rehab grant update. There have been 11 grants submitted to Thoma Consultants. Of those 11, 8 applicants are eligible, 2 are ineligible, and 1 is still under review. Of the 8 applications that are eligible, 2 are rental properties and 6 are one family residential.
- O The Clerk/Treasurer and Deputy Clerk/Treasurer will be attending the NYCOM conference from Sept. $16^{th}-20^{th}$. The office will be covered by former Deputy Clerk Barb McNamara on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 9am-1pm.

• Village Attorney S. DiGiorgio

- The owner of 155 Buell Ave. property is willing to convey the property to the Village. If the Village accepts the property, the Village will also assume the costs of demolishing the property. If the Village does not want to accept the property, legal action against the owner can be taken to have him fix the property.
 - Mayor Ostrander stated that the house needed to be demolished
 - DPW Superintendent J. Bechy will get more information on possible options for demolition of the building.

13. Mayor's Report

- There has been an influx of signs on Village property, mainly at the point of the park on Main St. and the park near Madison St. Non-Village signs are not allowed on Village owned property. The signs have been removed by the Village DPW.
- Mayor Ostrander wanted to clarify some statements from the last Town of Sangerfield board meeting that appeared in the Waterville Times. The Village is not the "lead agency" for any projects regarding Big Creek in the Town of Sangerfield or for culvert projects within the Village. The Village will not conduct a flow study for the culverts since they are owned by the Town of Sangerfield. Mayor Ostrander also stated that the Oriskany Creek Watershed Commission does not have any involvement with culverts.
- The next Oriskany Creek Watershed Commission meeting will be September 19 at 4:30 in Westmoreland.
- Mayor Ostrander would like to close the Clerk's Office on Friday's due to the lack of traffic
 flow. Mayor Ostrander felt the cost to keep the Village Hall open, especially during the winter
 months, was not economical for the four hours the office was open. The clerks will adjust their
 schedule so they're still working their normal total hours per week.
